

We are delighted to provide governors in Darlington with our new comprehensive training programme. Each term our programme includes a briefing for all governors and core training on Ofsted inspections, induction for new governors and keeping children safe in education, as well as new courses. The majority of our training is delivered online via Teams and is offered with the choice of attending from 1.00 to 2.30pm or 6.00 to 7.30pm on the same date unless otherwise stated. Please see below for full details. All courses are available to governors from schools who have purchased our annual training programme. If your school has not purchased our annual training programme, courses can be accessed on a pay as you go basis at £75 per governor per course attended. Please discuss with your school before booking.

Our training programme has been developed to support governors to be effective in their role, build on existing knowledge and learn about new areas to strengthen their skills and expertise.

## FREE: Governor Briefing

The briefing is held each term and includes updates on local and national education and governance developments, the Local Authority papers for governing body meetings and governor training information. There is also the opportunity for governors to share information and discuss topical issues affecting Darlington schools.

## Core training - Induction for new governors

This comprehensive session is an excellent opportunity for newly appointed governors to develop an understanding of their role, how governing bodies work and aims to provide governors with knowledge, skills, and confidence.

## Core training - Preparing for Ofsted

This essential course will help governors develop their understanding of the inspection process, what Ofsted requires of the school and governing body and the evidence on which inspectors base their judgements. Governors will learn how to ask appropriate questions of the headteacher and senior staff, as part of their role in holding leaders to account.

## Core training - FREE: Keeping Children Safe in Education

This 1 hour session is an excellent opportunity to keep up to date with the latest guidance to understand the roles and responsibilities of all those involved in safeguarding. Governors will be equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to monitor the effectiveness and impact of safeguarding arrangements in school.

## NEW: Wellbeing for headteachers and chairs

Following a mid-morning break, the 2nd part of the session will explore having difficult conversations and introduce skills and a framework to support colleagues through activities, videos and discussion points.

## NEW: EHE in Darlington

The number of young people registered as elective home education (EHE) is increasing across the country. This new course is an excellent opportunity for governors to learn more about the local picture in Darlington and what EHE means for young people, families, schools and the local authority. Delivered by Darlington Borough Council's EHE Advisor, governors have the chance to develop a greater understanding about the processes and responsibilities of all those involved and know what to check back at school about their own EHE young people.

## NEW: Governing self-review strategy

This session provides an opportunity to reflect on your own contribution to governance along with board impact. It will also outline what effective self review practice looks like and resources available, along with signposts to guidance you can access should you need further support.

### **NEW: Expansion of childcare and wraparound; a governors' guide to the changes**

### **NEW: LGBT+ Inclusion for governors**
